From the Pastor's Desk

"My soul thirsts for God, the living God. When can I enter and see the face of God?" ~Psalm 42:3

The peace of Jesus Christ be with you! As some of you know, I will be going on a pilgrimage to Rome this coming week and will be gone until the 21st. I am grateful for the priests who will be covering the weekend Masses the next two weekends as well as the August 15th Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Holy Day Mass at 7 PM. Please let me know if you would like me to pray for your intentions at the holy places. You can email them to me. My email is at the top of the front page of the bulletin.

The experience of going on pilgrimage drives home the truth that, in this world, all those who follow Jesus Christ are pilgrims journeying to our true and eternal home. For more than seventeen centuries pilgrims have crossed the thresholds of the most ancient churches in the city of Rome thirsting to enter that home and see the face of the living God. Pilgrimage itself involves journeying to a place which has significance to our Faith. The first places of pilgrimage were the sites of the Holy Land and the tombs of the Apostles. The tombs of St. Peter and St. Paul have been sites of pilgrimage before Christianity was legalized.

Even now with all our modern means of transportation, travel involves some discomfort and sacrifice. Now imagine if you had to walk from somewhere in Europe all the way to Rome or the Holy Land. Pilgrimages could take several months or maybe even a year or two to accomplish. Why do people go on pilgrimage? I think there can be many reasons which boil down to one; because pilgrimages are transformative.

The physical rigors of this journey offer the opportunities to deny oneself and promote deeper conversion; a central facet of the Christian life. I can speak from my own experiences of going on pilgrimage to Rome, the Holy Land, and other places like Fatima and Lourdes about the unique and transforming nature of pilgrimage. Walking in the footsteps of thousands of fellow pilgrims throughout the ages encourages us on our own personal path of conversion. Many sinners-turned-saints have "fought the good fight" before us and now cheer us on. The experience of praying at the tombs of the early Church martyrs reminds us that we are "surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses" who can intercede for us at the throne of the Lamb who shed His blood for our salvation. Being steeped in the richest traditions and expressions of our Faith deepens our sense of belonging to something and Someone greater than ourselves. Ultimately, the pilgrimages give flesh and bone to the central truths of the Christian Faith: self-denial, the journey of faith, conversion, forgiveness of sin, the communion of saints, the resurrection of the body, and love that is stronger than death.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) to Begin in September

Formerly known as RCIA (they changed it from "Rite" to "Order", our parish will again be offering this opportunity for adults who either 1) Are Catholic, but have not received all the Sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist); 2) Are Christian but not Catholic and want to learn more about Catholicism; 3) Are not baptized and want to learn more about Catholicism. 4) Grew up Catholic and fell away and want to come back to living their Catholic Faith.
