From the Pastor's Desk

State of the Parish

Peace to you! I hope that all of you can come on over to enjoy the School Pancake Breakfast and Bingo Sunday morning! The proceeds go to our parish school to help pay our teachers' salaries.

After the Feast of our Patron, St. Charles Borromeo, and reflecting on the many blessings of our parish, I thought it would be good to give a little "State of the Parish" reflection today. There are various aspects to assessing the state of a parish community, but it seems to me there are two main categories: Spiritual and Temporal.

The spiritual state of a parish community involves the life of grace, which would include tangible/visible things such as reception of sacraments, Mass attendance, works of charity and Christian service, care for the parish community members, growth in ministries (such as visiting the homebound, religious education, our school, etc...). The spiritual state of a parish also involves less visible realities such as deeper conversion, growth in faith, habits of prayer among individuals and in our homes, and personal study of the teachings of Jesus.

In my estimation, the following are noteworthy "data points" concerning the spiritual health of our parish. -In the past year, we have lost 8 parishioners to death. We have had 6 baptisms. 4 confirmations. 8 first Holy Communions. We have at least 14 parishioners who are homebound or in assisted living/nursing homes.

- -We have just about 200 families on our parish registry. Our average weekend Mass attendance is about 140. -There have been 140+ confessions heard at St. Charles. Which is up from 127 in 2022 and 85 in 2021.
- -We started OCIA just over a year ago. Since then, we have had 12 participants.
- -Our daily Mass attendance is about 3-8 people (not including school children or staff).
- -School Enrollment (4K-6th grade) is 21 students. In comparison, our enrollment was 36 in 2017.

The temporal state of our parish concerns things like finances, buildings and grounds, giving, capital campaigns, and other goods of this world. Some important aspects of the temporal state of our parish for this past year include, in my estimation:

- -We met and exceeded our 5-year Capital Campaign goal of \$215,000! To date, we have \$234,566.25 pledged. We have received \$91,882.07 to date, with \$49,693.34 of that amount designated for our parish projects, beginning with our bell tower repairs, then moving on to our church basement repairs.
- -Our Offertory giving (envelopes) was \$159,000 for the year. This is down from \$166,300 last year and \$174,500 in 2018. Total income was \$347,437.
- -This past year our expenses were \$402,012 which means that we operated at a deficit of \$54,575 last year. We also operated at a deficit 2021-2022. We are budgeted (educated guess) to be about at a \$50,000 deficit this coming fiscal year (2023-2024).
- -How did we come to being so far in the red? It has been a combination of factors. Less offertory from fewer parishioners, less tuition from the school, plus rising costs. We had been looking at a steadily growing budget deficit for the past several years, but some of that was softened by the Payroll Protection Plan money we received in 2020. Now that that money has been used, we have seen in the past two years the real financial picture of our parish.

Where do we go from here? I am, of course, very open to hearing your thoughts and ideas. I propose a few ways we can focus our efforts and come together for the good of our parish community, just like we did for the Capital Campaign.

- 1. Focus on prayer and growing closer to God. We are not only facing temporal hurdles, but spiritual forces as well. Each of us must commit ourselves to growing in holiness by daily prayer, weekly Mass, regular Confession, and service to others. What is your spiritual growth plan for this year?
- 2. Focus on evangelization. Numbers are not everything, but Jesus has commanded us to spread the Good News. There are many people whom God is calling to be members of our parish or to re-engage in their Catholic Faith. Reaching out to others will help both the spiritual and temporal state of our parish.
- 3. On the temporal side, I propose at least a three-prong approach. A) Increase our giving to the parish according to our means. I encourage us to do this via the Diocesan Annual Appeal. The reason being that, all the money given above our "goal" comes back to our parish "tax-free." I will explain this more next week. B) Outreach to St. Charles School alumni. Our school is our parish's biggest expense (about 80-85% of our budget). We have hundreds of alumni who have moved away from our parish, but who are still connected to us. They can help our school to continue to operate. Let me know if you would like to help with this

outreach effort. C) Being more intentional about our giving. For example, utilizing the Scrip program or Kwik Trip rewards program. Estate planning and Planned Giving. Setting up your giving via ACH or Bill Pay so that if you are out of town, you are still giving to the parish offertory.

Despite the challenges that we face, both spiritual and temporal, Jesus Christ is Lord and He is with us! The Church and our parish have faced many challenges in the past, but God has helped us through them. I am confident that if we stay close to Him, grow in our faith in Him, and work together, then our parish will remain strong for many more years to come and will bear great fruit.
