From the Pastor's Desk

Not-So-Ordinary Time

Peace to you! This past week was the first week of Ordinary Time and this Sunday marks the beginning of the 2nd week of Ordinary Time. We will have 5 ½ weeks of Ordinary time before Ash Wednesday (1st day of Lent) and then weeks 7-34 after the conclusion of the Easter Season. What are these approximately 34 weeks of Ordinary Time all about?

Ordinary Time does not mean "normal" or "usual" time, but rather "ordered" or "ordinal" time (e.g. "ordinal numbers"). This the longest "season" of the Liturgical Year, and consists of counting the 34 weeks that are not in the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter. The color of Ordinary Time is green. I don't know if it is an official explanation, but when I see green I think of growth, life, and plants growing. This is the time when we focus as a Church on "growing" in our knowledge and love of the whole of the Mystery of Faith. What is the "mystery of faith?" We say at the Mass in response to the priest, "We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection, until you come again." The mystery of faith is the "whole story" of our creation, fall, and redemption (or Created, Captured, Rescued, Response). It is the invisible plan of God being made visible through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, which continues through the action of the Holy Spirit in the Church (particularly through the Sacraments), until the end of time and the Second Coming of Jesus.

I think that many Catholics think of living our faith or inviting others to faith in Jesus as something extraordinary. There is our "ordinary life" during which we go to work, change the oil in our car, clean the house, make dinner for the kids, go to school, go down to Rudy's for a beer, watch football, go fishing, etc..., and then there is our "faith life" which is when we say our prayers at night or go to church on Sunday. Making our faith the totality of our life is not something "ordinary" folks do, that is for people like priests, sisters, or monks. And as far as sharing our faith with others... well, ordinary people can't be expected to do that, right?

All of this is completely wrong. The main reason was the fact that Jesus Christ Himself lived most of His life in terms of what we would call "ordinary." All of our time, whether it is simply one of those drudgery days in the doldrums of January or the most special day of our life is important and can be supernaturalized and sanctified. We struggle with this idea because, as modern people, we primarily think of time as a resource or asset, rather than a gift from God. But if time is a resource (and an extremely limited one!) we are often filled with anxiety or frantic-ness in "spending" that precious resource. However, if time is a gift from God, then we can receive that gift every moment, even on the most "ordinary" of days, and return that time to God as an act of our love, whether we are praying at Mass or doing the dishes.

My hope is that during my time here that our parish's focus will be on how it can more become what it is meant to be: a center of evangelization. A place where "ordinary" people hear the Gospel, learn the Gospel, and then learn how to proclaim the Gospel to others. It really is simpler than you think. If we begin to make all of our time holy, and treat it as it truly is, a gift from God, then we will not be worried about how we "spend" it, but rather will be concerned with how we give it back to God. This is transformative, and will seep into our relationships with others. And when they ask why we are so joy-filled, even in this frantic world, we can say that it is because God loves us, and He entered into Time and transformed it forever. We can live with the time that we have from God with great peace, joy, and a desire to bring others to Jesus Christ and His Church. What better way to give back to God the time we have been given?
