From the Pastor's Desk

Parish Mission and Ask the Pastor

Peace to you! I hope you are planning on attending one or all three days of our parish mission. We will have three top-notch speakers who will lead us in our efforts to grow as disciples of Jesus. The Parish Mission will be three Sundays in a row and will run from 10:40 am – about 1 pm. It will include a 30-40 minute talk in the church, time for prayer, and fellowship in the parish hall from Noon-1 PM. This is a great event to invite your non-St. Charles friends to attend with you.

We have another great question for our "Ask the Pastor" section of the bulletin. I hope to also bring back our "Real Miracle Stories" (formerly known as "Miracle of the Week") and "Formed Reviews" sections. Please send to me any miracle stories or reviews of content from Formed to me to share with the rest of the parish!

Ask the Pastor

Question: "Father, I understand that not all the Psalms were written by David. Do we know how many and which ones? Do we know the authors of the other Psalms?"

Answer: Great question! Yes, we know that not all the Psalms were written by King David, but many of them were. We know this because the book of Psalms tell us. Some of the psalms will have the author in its title, such as Psalm 34, which is entitled "Praise for Deliverance from Trouble, A Psalm of David," or Psalm 87 which is entitled, "The Joy of Living in Zion, A Psalm of the Sons of Korah." But many of the psalms do not list their author.

The Book of Psalms (aka, "The Psalter") is actually a compilation of 5 small books or compilations of sacred hymns and other kinds of poetical compositions, such as prayers for specific liturgical occasions, lamentations, hymns of praise, etc... The psalms were used in, and many were composed for, worship in the Temple. Many or perhaps all of them were sung or chanted. Some of them date back to King David (or perhaps earlier), around 1,000 B.C., and others were written after the Exile, 587-539 B.C. These various compositions were gradually brought together into small collections, then one large collection of 5 books which became the hymnbook of the 2nd Temple (the temple built after the Exile and which existed during the time of Jesus). Christians continued to use the prayers of the Psalter after the example of Jesus Himself. They have always been used extensively in the Sacred Liturgy (Mass) from the time of the Apostles until now.

Although biblical scholars would likely debate about which psalms were written or composed by whom (biblical scholars seem to debate just about every possible topic), seventy three of the 150 psalms are attributed to King David. The other authors were Asaph, the Sons of Korah (who were members of the tribe of Levi who ministered in the Temple), Ethan the Ezrahite, Solomon, and perhaps other anonymous authors.

Ash Wednesday – Feb. 14

Please note that Ash Wednesday is on Wednesday, February 14th this year. Mass times at St. Charles will be 8:15 AM and 7:00 PM that day.

Ash Wednesday is one of two days when Catholics are required to fast (Good Friday is the 2nd day). This means eating only one meal that day. You can have two small "snacks" that together don't equal a 2nd meal. Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from eating meat.
