From the Pastor's Desk

Why Lent?

Peace to you! I hope you are planning on attending one, two, or all three days of our parish mission. Here are some powerful words from Pope St. Leo the Great (pope in the 400's) who explains why we have Lent each year. Note: "Paschal feast" means "Easter."

"The special note of the paschal feast is this: the whole Church rejoices in the forgiveness of sins. It rejoices in the forgiveness not only of those who are then reborn in holy baptism but also of those who are already numbered among God's adopted children. Initially, men are made new by the rebirth of baptism. Yet there still is required a daily renewal to repair the shortcomings of our mortal nature... All must therefore strive to ensure that on the day of redemption no one may be found in the sins of his former life. Dear friends, what the Christian should be doing at all times should be done now with greater care and devotion, so that the Lenten fast enjoined by the apostles may be fulfilled, not simply by abstinence from food but above all by the renunciation of sin." -St. Leo the Great

Real Miracle Stories

One of my favorite saints, St. Augustine of Hippo (the son of St. Monica), was the bishop of Hippo in North Africa in the early 400's. In one of his books, *City of God*, he recounts this miracle of a Christian woman he met named Innocentia. St. Augustine was, in his younger years, very skeptical about the existence of miracles. But Innocentia's story helped change his mind. Innocentia was a respected woman who discovered that she had cancer of the breast. Doctors gave her no hope, and St. Augustine reports, "She turned for help to God alone, in prayer." In a dream, Innocentia was told to wait in the church during the Easter Vigil, at which the adult catechumens (non-Christians being prepared to become Christian) are baptized. She was told in the dream to wait in the church for the first woman who came out of the baptismal font after receiving baptism, and to ask this woman to make the sign of Christ over her breast. Innocentia did so, and was completely cured from that moment.

I like this story because it points to the truth that God is the origin of miraculous healings. He can work even through the more ordinary and "small" people. This woman, never named, had been a baptized Christian for minutes, and yet, through her, God brought about great healing. It makes me wonder if He wants to do similar things through ordinary people like us as well.
