From the Pastor's Desk

Almsgiving: Part I

Peace to you! The first day of our parish mission was wonderful event and we had a good turnout. Chris Rogers' talk was very moving and the food for fellowship provided by our Women's Group was fantastic! All are welcome to come to the parish mission this Sunday and next Sunday after the 9:30 am Mass. We will also be having Stations of the Cross devotions from 6:30-7 pm on each Wednesday during the rest of Lent. This is a wonderful time-tested prayer that helps us meditate on how much Jesus loved us and how He redeemed us by His suffering and death. I hope you can join us for Stations! Please note the info below about the upcoming PTO fish fries and opportunities to receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before Easter.

Ask the Pastor

I have gotten three separate questions in the past few weeks regarding the Church, money, and charitable giving. I will put all three questions here and then answer them over the course of the next few weekends under the topic of Almsgiving. A great topic for Lent.

Question: Under Bl. Pope Pius IX, Peter's Pence was started. How did the Vatican get its earthly treasures? Question: The Vatican could resolve the hungry and poor issue with these treasures they have stored. How much are they giving to these people? Jesus told us to take care of these people. At least couldn't they copy other charitable organizations and match us laity donations?

Question: On a trip I met a priest and he stated that the pope gives 1 million dollars to the earthly church each day. It that true?

Answer: These are some good questions. But in order to answer them I have to address the claim that the Vatican could resolve the hunger and poverty issues with their "treasures." I have found that there are many common misunderstandings about the Catholic Church especially regarding money. One misunderstanding that I often encounter is the perception that the Catholic Church is a monolithic corporation, like Google or Ashley Furniture. Financially speaking, the Catholic Church is a bunch (hundreds of thousands?) of non-profit organizations with various degrees of affiliation to one another. For example, there is some financial connection between our parish and the Diocese of La Crosse, but there is not really any financial connection between our parish and a Catholic parish in Cameroon or the diocese of Krakow, Poland. Catholic parishes throughout the world have a loose and indirect financial connection to the Pope, the Vatican, or the Holy See. Remember, there are various types of assets, such as cash, property, and investments. Our parish, for example, has all three. The purpose of these assets is to further the mission of the Church. Whether it is our parish or the Vatican, all of these assets ultimately originated from free will donations.

Meat includes all beast and fowl flesh (beef, pork, chicken, duck, etc...), but not fish or seafood. These are days of solidarity for us as Catholics as we follow Christ together this Lent. And so, as a worldwide Catholic family, we have common Lenten practices of fasting by which we lift our hearts up to God in prayer.
