From the Pastor's Desk

Our Parish's Lenten Mission

Peace to you! One great way to describe any parish's mission is four words: "Be disciples, make disciples." It is one way to describe *the* mission that Jesus gave to His disciples, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations..." Remember that "mission" means "a sending out." Jesus sends us out to do something. But before He gave His disciples their mission, He accomplished His own mission.

Lent is coming in only 1 ½ weeks. Lent is the time to reflect on Jesus' mission to rescue us from sin, death, and Satan. He came to reconcile us to God, and to save us from our sins (that which separates us from God). He accomplished this by His life, suffering (passion), death, and resurrection, which is what we celebrate on Easter. In order to help us reflect upon Jesus' mission and for us to enter more deeply into our mission to be disciples (students) of Jesus and to lead others to be His students, our parish is hosting a Parish Mission.

Please save the date and make plans to attend! We will have three top-notch speakers who will lead us in our efforts to grow as disciples of Jesus and to understand better how the Holy Eucharist and Mass fits into our following of Jesus. The Parish Mission will be three Sundays in a row and will run from 10:40 am – about 1 pm. It will include a talk, time for prayer, and fellowship. These are great events to also invite your friends to attend.

Ask the Pastor

We are back with a couple good questions! I will answer one this week and another next week. Question 1: "Father, when did we people stop folding our hands in prayer? Was there a reason?" Answer: This is an interesting question and I hope I can answer it. I guess I don't really pay attention to what people are doing with their hands when they are praying, whether at Mass or otherwise. I am usually focused on God and on what I am doing at Mass. In general, there is no mandated way to have our hands when we pray. We can pray always, even while our hands are at work. However, I will answer that if people are not folding their hands while they are praying, I would recommend doing it for a couple of reasons. 1) We are bodily beings. What we do with our bodies does truly impact our souls. How we comport ourselves helps to form our attitudes. If we act casual around certain people, we will treat them and others casually. If we act formal around people, we will be more formal to everyone. 2) We are also creatures of habit. Teaching others to fold their hands when they pray helps to, in the future, keep our attention on the task of prayer. It is so easy to get distracted. If people do not fold their hands in prayer, I don't know the exact reason, but if I were to speculate a couple reasons could be that they were not taught how to or that they were taught, but fell out of the habit. In any case, the important thing is to focus our hearts and minds on God when we pray.

Ash Wednesday is one of two days when Catholics are required to fast (Good Friday is the 2nd day). This means eating only one meal that day. You can have two small "snacks" that together don't equal a 2nd meal. Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from eating meat.
