From the Pastor's Desk

Welcome Bishop Gerard Battersby!

Peace to you! I will have to put a pause on my movie reviews that I promised to write about in order to share my welcomes to our future bishop, Bishop Gerard Battersby. On Tuesday, March 19th, it was announced that Pope Francis had accepted Bishop William Callahan's letter of resignation, which cited health reasons, and had appointed Bishop Battersby to be the 11th bishop of the Diocese of La Crosse, starting May 20th. Bishop Battersby has been serving for about 7 years as an auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Detroit. What is an auxiliary bishop? For big dioceses like Detroit or Chicago (or even Milwaukee), it is common to have the bishop who is the leader of the diocese, but also to have one or more other bishops who assist him in things like celebrating Confirmations, and other pastoral and administrative duties. It would be like if I had another priest here at the parish. I would be the pastor and the other guy would be the parochial vicar (basically means, "priest at this parish").

I was able to attend the press conference on Tuesday at 10:30 am and to meet Bishop Battersby for the first time, but not before I did a little personal research on him. I reached out to two priest friends who I thought might know Bishop Battersby personally, and I was correct. And both gave glowing reports! That helped calm my nerves a bit (I have only ever had Bishop Callahan as my bishop since I have been ordained, and almost all of my time in seminary as well). But I was truly set at ease when I got to meet him on Tuesday morning. This is my first impression. He is very relatable, easy to talk to, and very eager to learn and serve. He and I joked about the "fun" of moving. He said that he tries to look on the bright side and see it as an opportunity of divesting himself of all the stuff that tend to accumulate, like "Footprints in the Sand" plaques. He said, "How many of those does one actually need anyway?" I responded by holding up a "zero" with my hand. And he laughed.

But there were three things that really struck me in his press conference statement, which I recommend you watch. The first is that he said, "I don't come to you as the best bishop that you could receive. If you want a the best bishop you can receive, then you are going to have to fast and pray for me. That the Holy Spirit might make me the one that you need." This statement spoke to me and reminded me of the truth that we are all the Body of Christ and the spiritual reality that we are fighting a spiritual battle. If we want our bishop to be a good shepherd, then we need to strengthen him by our prayers and fasting, offered for him and his ministry. This is true for your pastor as well.:)

The second thing he said, quoting Bishop Quinn, the retired bishop of Winona, "It is not about me and it is not about you. It is about Him. And when we begin to understand that it is about Him, then it can be all about us together with Him and through Him and with Him." I was encouraged when I heard this because it told me that our new bishop is a man of deep prayer and that He knows and loves Jesus and wants to serve Him, and nobody else. When we focus the work of the Church on Jesus and His will, then we will be ok.

"I am also aware that God has something new planned for La Crosse. And I mean that, not because I am here and I am special, but because Jesus is Lord. And He is risen. And we, you and me, are His witnesses." This statement hit home for me. It shows me that our new bishop is focused on bringing the Gospel to all the people of the diocese, not just the Catholics who are in the pews. And he sees that all of us play a part in this. We have nothing to fear, because Jesus is the Lord and He is risen. He will do great things here if we remain close to him.

I encourage you, if you are able, to attend with me the Mass of Installation for Bishop Battersby on Monday, May 20th (time details forthcoming) at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in La Crosse. It would be great to have a good contingent of our parish there to welcome him and pray for him as he begins his ministry. Let us continue to pray for Bishop Callahan and offer to God gratitude for his care and leadership these past almost 14 years. I will be forever grateful to him for being the one to walk with me through my seminary time and for calling me to be ordained to the priesthood of Jesus Christ. And for supporting me in my time serving as a priest these past 8 years.

Lenten Practices

No Meat Fridays: All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from eating meat for all Catholics ages 14 and older. Meat includes all beast and fowl flesh (beef, pork, chicken, duck, etc...), but not fish or seafood. Good Friday Fasting: On Good Friday, all Catholics age 18-59 are required to fast from food. This means only one meal is to be taken that day. Two smaller "snacks" may be eaten to keep up strength.
