From the Pastor's Desk

Easter Triumph, Easter Joy

Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Happy Easter to you all! Holy Week is always a very grace-filled time in the life of the Church. It is a time of spiritual growth for so many as we participate in the sacred rites of the Triduum and Easter. The Easter Vigil is the time when many people are baptized or received into the Church. At our parish, we welcome four new members of the Church at the Easter Vigil, Lane, Tessa, and Scott! Lane was baptized and Tessa and Scott came into full communion with the Catholic Church. All three received the Sacrament of Confirmation and their First Holy Communion. Lane's daughter Woodson was also baptized. Congratulations and welcome to the Catholic Church! We are so very happy to have you as a part of the Church and our parish.

Our parish has so much to celebrate. God is pouring our His grace at our parish and among our people! Alleluia! Praise the Lord!

One of my favorite Easter hymns is "At the Lamb's High Feast." The fourth verse begins with "Easter triumph! Easter joy! This alone can sin destroy." The third verse of the hymn, however, explains the origin of both Easter triumph and Easter joy, which is what Jesus accomplished by His suffering, death, and resurrection. Looking back, it is a great blessing and I simply say, 'thank you' to all the wonderful people who have been part of my journey, especially the priests, deacons, religious, and holy women who have been so kind to me over these 14 years. Their friendship and mentorship have taught me to be mindful of what it means to be brothers and sisters of Christ and sons and daughters of God. As I move forward, I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to everyone who has made my time in the Diocese of La Crosse so meaningful. I look forward to continuing my service to Bishop Battersby and spiritual service to brother priests and deacons in La Crosse. I am grateful for the opportunity to remain in this wonderful community for as long as God allows, and I will cherish the memories and experiences I have had here. Thank you for allowing me to fulfill God's call among you. Be assured of my daily prayer and happy memories."
