From the Pastor's Desk

What is in a Name?

Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! I have to make a correction from last week's bulletin. I got the name of the documentary about Divine Mercy wrong. It is called "Divine Mercy with Fr. Ask the Pastor

Q: Why does God change the names of people in the Bible?

A: Great question! I don't think there is any absolute answer out there, but we can deduce a few things from the Scriptural texts themselves. The short answer to this question is that a name change signifies a new call in life. It is symbolic of a new identity or a new mission.

In the Old Testament, God gives several people new names. Abram, which means "exulted father" becomes "Abraham," which means "father of a multitude." God changes Abram's name after He makes a covenant with him. One of the promises of God to Abram in that covenant is that Abram will be "the father of many nations." And so, we can see in this name change a reminder for Abraham of God's promise to him. Sarai, Abram's wife, becomes "Sarah" which means "princess." She was to become the matriarch of these many nations, and thus the mother of a multitude. Jacob, which means "deceitful one" or "supplanter" (literally, "leg-puller"). Jacob was quite a deceitful supplanter until after wrestling with God all night, when God changed His name to Israel, which means "He who strives with God," and Israel did strive with God all the way to the Promised Land, and then some!

In the New Testament, Jesus changes Simon the fisherman's name to Peter. "Jesus looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You will be called Kephas' (which is translated Peter)" (Jn 1:42). Kephas means something like "rock" or "rocky." Why did the Lord call this man "Rock?" Because of the mission he was about to receive. "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it'" (Mt 16:18). The fisherman from Bethsaida had become the rock, or the building stone, of the Church. God had chosen him with a new mission. He was now a fisher of men. His new name gave him his identity as the first pope and leader of the Church.

Now think of marriage and the custom of the woman changing her last name. When a woman marries, she normally drops her maiden name and takes on the name of her husband. She is no longer a maiden, but rather is now a married woman. They are entering into a new state of life and that they are now forming a new family.

Today, those who enter religious orders often get a new name. In generations past, religious sisters and brothers were more common in the life of the Church in the USA. For any third- or fourth-grader who had Sister Mary Paul of the Sacred Heart as his or her teacher, the question might have arisen of where did she get that name from? Didn't her parents know she was a girl? Why did they name her Mary Paul? The answer lies in the fact that the taking of a new name symbolizes the entering of a new state in life. Customs vary on what a newly professed name could be. Sometimes the women are allowed to suggest a new name (or a short list of possible names). In other instances, sisters are given a name. In either case the ultimate decision was in the hands of the superior of the order.

In the places where the Church is evangelizing a non-Christian culture, the new Christians (even adults) receive a new name at their baptism. This especially happens if their given name has pagan connotations or meanings. Nowadays, when a baby is baptized the given name and the baptismal name are the same. This is because in baptism we have a new identity in Christ, a whole new life which participates in the Divine Life of God. We become children of God. This is also why when adults are Confirmed, they often take on another name after a Saint which they have a connection or whom they desire to imitate.
