From the Pastor's Desk

Next Weekend's Mission Co-op

Peace to you! Next weekend is our Mission Co-op and we welcome Fr. Marushan to our parish to celebrate the Holy Eucharist with us and share with us what it is like to live as a Catholic in mission territory. If you are able to help support this Mission, thank you for your generosity and for bringing your donations next weekend. Please read the information about Fr. Marushan's home diocese in Sri Lanka.

A brief outlook: The Diocese of Batticaloa, Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka, which was known as Ceylon, is a small but beautiful island in the Indian Ocean. It is also named as the pearl of the Indian Ocean. It is a Buddhist country with two languages, three ethnic groups and four religions: Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam and Christianity. Christianity was introduced to Sri Lanka in 1505 by the Portuguese. At present, Christians are a minority of 7% of the total population, numbering almost 21 million people in Sri Lanka.

The diocese has an area of 2,854 sq. kilometers and a population of 1,289,000. Batticaloa's diocese comprises Hindus, Buddhists, Muslims, and Christians. Christians are a minority in Sri Lanka as well as in the Eastern Province. The number of Catholics in the Batticaloa diocese is 46,138 (3.5%) of the total population of the two civil districts of Batticaloa viz, Batticaloa and Ampara. The Catholics have spread out of 30 parishes, which are served by nearly 39 diocesan priests and 16 religious priests. In addition, 93 religious sisters and brothers serve in parishes, schools, hospitals, colleges, and universities. Additionally, we have more than five hundred catechists serving in the diocese. Their role is very crucial in the diocese. Since the children are not taught the Catholic religion in most of the schools, the diocese has taken different methods to provide the Catholic faith to the children at the parish levels. The diocese is offering continuous training programs for these catechists through the catechetical center.

Activities of the Diocese of Batticaloa

The diocese of Batticaloa has different offices: Catechetical Centre. Social Service Centre. Social Communication Centre, Office for Youth Apostolate, Office for Pontifical Mission Societies, Office for Ecumenism, Laity Commission, Lay Theologate Institute, and Office for Evangelization. Further, it has 11 apostolic associations. In Addition, it has ten orphanages for boys and girls very specially the diocese has "Ozanam Center" home for handicapped female children. The Siloam Hospital is the diocese medical care center offering services to many people in the district. It is especially organizing many health awareness programs on prevention practices at the village level. The diocese has also made a special effort to serve the lepers in the district, which is very much neglected by many organizations. The Social Service Center is the social arm of the diocese through which the diocese is trying to implement some projects, Supplementary classes for children's education, widow's livelihood programs, and healing and reconciliation programs. Through the evangelization office and Laity commission, the diocese gives formation programs for the laity. More focus is given to re-evangelization. Bible classes are given at the parish level. Further, the diocese is also doing border village evangelization activities amid a multi-religious society. Small Christian Communities are formed through which bible sharing takes place. They are continually empowered through training programs. The diocese also pays more concentration to the lay catechists, who teach Sunday classes at the parish. In small parishes, there are about 100 to 150 children; in larger parishes, there are more than 500 to 800 children who follow the Sunday class. Since the diocese has more village parishes, the diocese provides breakfast or some snacks to poor children who attend Sunday classes. Due to financial constraints, the diocese is unable to pay a small stipend to the catechists who are very poor. Further, the diocese is facing a shortage of lay catechists with the increasing number of Catholics in the diocese. The office for the Youth apostolate is training the youth to become active leaders, new evangelizers, and coworkers to take up various types of ministries within the parish and diocese.

Challenges

- The diocese is receiving more vocations for the priesthood but has no means to provide food and accommodation for the new seminarians.
- The diocese needs more lay catechists and more training programs. The catechists are very poor and need some stipends for their voluntary work.
- Education of the children in supplementary classes.
- OZANAM Centre, handicapped children.
- Churches destroyed by war/tsunami must be rebuilt/renovated.
- Livelihood projects for widows.
- Healing and reconciliation programs and formation programs for youth.
- More re evangelization programs are needed in border villages among multi-religious people.

The diocese of Batticaloa is a new diocese with immense challenges. The diocese is growing in many spheres and has started the mission Cooperative plan in the US in 2016. We learned about different dioceses and their people's generosity through the mission appeals. The donations that we have received from these appeals helped us to cover a specific part of our projects. The Mission Cooperative plan is an excellent opportunity given by God to share our experience and the difficulties that we are facing in our country. It is also giving us great hope that we are not alone, but we are part of the universal Church. The Diocese of Batticaloa would like to acknowledge and thank all of you for your spiritual and financial contribution. – Fr. Merushan
