# From the Pastor's Desk

For Jesus Christ and Others: Part 2

Peace to you! I don't know about you, but I keep getting this sense that God is doing incredible things in our parish, our diocese, our country, and even throughout the world. God the Holy Spirit is alive and active in the hearts of many believers who are responding to His promptings. The Holy Spirit is moving people to seek healing, to repentance and conversion, to reconciliation (with God and with others), to knowledge of God, to a deeper life of prayer, to various outreaches and ministries, and to holiness of life, just to name a few that I have noticed.

When I ask God for guidance about our parish, the Scripture passage that keeps coming to me has been, "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness (bring people into friendship with Jesus), and all these things will be given you besides" (Matt. 6:33). It is all about Jesus and bringing others to Him.

Last weekend I gave you and overview of the financial state of our parish. Praise God that the work of our parish has been funded this past year. And thank you all for your faith and generosity! Now I want to let you know more about the "Spiritual overview" of our parish.

By the numbers, this past year we have had 5 baptisms, 6 Confirmations, 7 First Holy Communions, 0 Marriages, and 4 deaths. This is how I interpret "the numbers" from this past year. There are amazing things happening at St. Charles! We have had several new families join our parish this past year. We had 3 people come into full communion with the Church at Easter Vigil. But God wants much more!

My sense is that there are a few people in our parish who have grown a lot stronger in their spiritual lives this past year. They are praying more, they are making efforts to learn so that they understand better their Catholic beliefs, and their relationship with God is making a real impact on other aspects of their lives. I also think that many of our parishioners are struggling with their faith in God. They don't quite know what the Church teaches and why. Their relationship with God is not going well. Praying is difficult and finding time to pray is even more difficult. Many parishioners have given up on coming to Mass, if not every Sunday, then definitely most Sundays.

But how do we reach out to those that are struggling or who don't even know Jesus Christ? Are we convicted that Our Lord has commanded us to "Go and make disciples of ALL nations"? That means all people. Even the person you think will "never" become Catholic or never be religious or never believe in God. Especially that person! But how do we start turning the tide?

I was at a retreat this past week for all the administrators of Catholic Schools for our diocese. Bishop Battersby was the retreat director and speaker for the retreat. One comment from the Bishop really struck me, "People don't have hope because they don't pray." I think this is the first step. We need to pray so that we can come to SEE where God is at work and then to cooperate with that work God has already begun. We <u>must</u> be begging God to help us. We have to place our hope, not in our own smarts, words, or even our good example, but in the powerful working of His grace. *We* will not be the primary cause of people coming to know God or to love Him, but God the Holy Spirit will be. He is at work in people's hearts. It is our task to be attentive to God in prayer and trustingly bold in our response. I am convinced that God is up to a lot of good. Many of our parishioners can already attest to that. Let's continue to grow in our ability to pay attention to God, to grow in friendship with Him ourselves, then invite others to come. Let us commit to daily prayer for God's work to be done in our own hearts and our parish.

La Crosse Jail ministry helps us to fulfill the corporal work of mercy of "visiting the imprisoned." Thank you for helping with the needs that that ministry. They are in need of the following: Backpacks, Sweatpants for men and women, Short sleeve shirts, Underwear and socks, Sneakers – for males and females, Backpacks, Female underwear – needs to be new, Female sports bras – needs to be new. These can be dropped off at Coulee Life Church in Onalaska, right next to Sand Lake Elementary on Sand Lake Road. The doors are open 9 to 6 every day and there is a bench to set them on.

Justice Support Services could use the following: Back packs, Deodorant, Shampoo, Rain ponchos, Hand Sanitizer, Travel size bug spray, Men/women underwear. These can be dropped off in the jail lobby, they are open 8 am to 4:30 p.m. They provide them to folks just getting out and currently out that are homeless and/or without resources.

#### Archbishop Listecki Petitions to Intervene in Abortion Case before the WI Supreme Court

Please pray his voice will be heard and heeded! On July 2, the Wisconsin Supreme Court agreed to hear a case from Planned Parenthood that seeks to find a constitutional right to abortion within the Wisconsin Constitution. On July 15, Milwaukee Archbishop Jerome Listecki filed a petition to intervene in the Planned Parenthood case, arguing that he has a religious obligation "to vindicate the constitutional rights of the unborn in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, particularly their rights to life and to equal protection of the laws under the 14th Amendment and to any claimed state constitutional right to bodily integrity, autonomy, and self-determination." Wisconsin's other bishops subsequently issued a statement of support for the Archbishop's petition, stating that they too have a religious obligation to care for the souls of every human life—born and unborn—in their respective dioceses, and that both sides deserve to be heard at the Wisconsin Supreme Court.
