Knitting with Pam: Pam Jeffers has volunteered again to offer knitting lessons at the end of the day, starting in October. She will teach the students in 4th-6<sup>th</sup> grade to knit a kitchen scrubby (perfect for birthday or Christmas gifts!). The cost is \$5.00 for the yarn needed. If your child worked with Pam last year and has leftover yarn, or if you'd like to purchase your own colors (scrubby knitting yarn from Wal Mart, Michaels, or Hobby Lobby), then there is no cost. She'll provide the knitting needles. She'd like to begin Tuesday, October 1<sup>st</sup> so that the kids can finish before Christmas. If your child would like to participate, just write a note in their agenda and send the \$5 if applicable. We'll be sure to get the bus riders done before bus time.

<u>Inclement Weather Reminder</u>: We will keep the children indoors at the end of the day if the weather is too rainy or cold. Please come into the school to pick up your child if you don't see anyone out on the playground. We will follow De Soto's announcement for any school closings. You can always check the news channels for closures (keep in mind that the announcement will be for De Soto schools, NOT St. Charles school), sign up for a text directly from De Soto schools, (see instruction below to sign up for Message Alert), or wait for an email from Mrs. Hytry. If school has to close early for any reason we will notify you through email and follow your emergency pick-up plan that you filled out in your school packet.

SchoolMessengerSetup (SMS): We offer text message notification service to all the school families. Three days after you send your request, please text "YES" to 67587 to opt-in to receive SMS messages from De Soto Area Schools.

**Early Dismissal forms:** Enclosed is the first attempt at the Early Dismissal procedure for inclement weather or other. Please look carefully at the phone numbers, etc. as I did have a hard time with some as I was entering them on the form. The right-hand column for destination may need attention. <u>Safe Environment:</u> At St. Charles we work hard to keep your child safe and provide a warm and nurturing environment for them to flourish in. Part of this safe environment is **ensuring that the person or person(s) picking your child up from school are approved by you. If you have not filled out and returned the form please do so as soon as possible. If you need another form please contact Carrol in the office.** 

<u>Snacks</u>: We do have a student in the 4K-1<sup>st</sup> grade classroom with an allergy to nuts. The nut allergy is not severe but, to be safe, <u>any treats should be free from nuts or nut products</u>. Please remember that any snacks brought to school should be on the more nutritious side, rather than more to the just-sweet side. If you are planning treats for the whole school please avoid foods with nuts and nut products

# ST. CHARLES SCHOOL RAISERIGHT PROGRAM

Dear Families and Friends,

Thanks to everyone that has continued to use RaiseRight aka Scrip. For those that are not familiar with RaiseRight, RaiseRight is a year-round fundraising program where you can buy gift cards from over 750 brands and earn money for St. Charles PTO while you shop. You purchase gift cards at face value, and we earn a certain percentage back. The percentage earned is dependent on the brand. During the 2023-2024 school year, we earned \$1311 from the RaiseRight program.

You can start earning money today by downloading the RaiseRight app or joining on raiseright.com/shop. The PTOs enrollment code is 5ADDDA5E65615.

There are multiple options of buying gift cards for places you are already shopping at every day. If you download the app or join online you can immediately purchase eGift cards. Some popular brands you can get eGift cards for are Amazon, Walmart, Starbucks, Best Buy, Target, Kohls, and so many more. When you purchase eGift cards, by either linking your bank account or using your credit card, you can immediately start using those gift cards in stores with your phone. There is a higher fee for using your credit card, so I suggest linking your bank account. This may take a couple of days to set up but is very easy to do.

Another option is purchasing physical gift cards. Not all brands offer eGift cards, plus, some people like having a physical card in their hand. If you order physical gift cards online or through the app, these orders have to be placed through the coordinator (me) and are shipped directly to the school. Your order will remain pending until I place a bulk order.

Please keep in mind, there is a shipping charge associated each time an order is placed for physical gift cards. If there are not enough orders from families to cover the shipping costs, I'll wait to place the order until enough orders come in. I'll notify anyone that has an order waiting if this happens. Once the order is placed, it only takes a few days for the cards to arrive at school.

The last option is the Reload option. Once you have a physical gift card and if the store has a reload option, you can add more money to the card by purchasing this online if you have an account set up. These gift cards can be used immediately in stores as well.

Several times a year I will place orders for physical cards. Order forms will be sent home in the Family Folder and placed in the back of church for those that are interested. More information to come when the first order will be placed this school year.

Please feel free to tell your family and friends about the program. It is fast and easy to use RaiseRight once you start doing it. You can even purchase eGift cards in the check-out line for those times you buy more than you planned.
