From the Pastor's Desk

Our Parish: Part 2

Peace be with you! I will be out of town this weekend for a family wedding and a family visit to my siblings in Nashville. See you all again next weekend. Let's continue to pray for and invite people to come to our OCIA group and learn more about Catholicism and begin making steps in their journey of faith! I put some copies of Karen Woodhouse's "Short History of St. Charles" in the vestibule. Feel free to take one! Otherwise, here is the next part of that publication. - Fr. Sedlacek

From A Short History of St. Charles Borromeo Parish by Karen Woodhouse

In 1906 a second church bell was purchased and is still used today alongside that first bell from the original church. The two bells were rung together for the first time on the feast day of St. Charles, November 4, 1906, and have been ringing together ever since. Many more years of tolling can be expected as repairs and maintenance to the bell tower was completed in 2024 with monies collected from generous pledges to the Capital Campaign.

Monsignor Kremer remained our pastor from 1901 until the time of his death in 1934. Under his stewardship, the first rectory was built. St. Charles Borromeo School opened in the church basement in 1907. Miss May Downey was the first teacher. In 1909 a two room, brick school house was built on the south side of the church. The Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration took over the school's teaching duties in 1925. In 1934 a large amount of soil and rock was excavated from the south edge of church property and sold to the Mississippi River dam project in order to enlarge the playground and parking lot.

In 1943 Father Bernard Duffy became pastor. During this time the parish purchased an additional 60 acres of land. One acre to the east of the church was cleared and leveled for the building of a new modern school. Father Nicholas Kreibich opened the new school in September of 1952. It is the one we still use today. With the declining number of Sisters available, the FSPAs ended forty-six years of teaching service to St. Charles in June of 1971. The parish decided to continue with an all-lay faculty. The school began its 118th school year this September 2024, educating children from 4-year-old Kindergarten through 6th grade.

Another long serving pastor was Father Oswald Schulte. After being a professor of biology for 20 years at Holy Cross Seminary, he plunged into parish life at St. Charles teaching, sanctifying, governing and maintaining our church and school. One day after dissecting a beef heart for a science class, the students were awestruck when he carefully wrapped the heart back up to cook for his supper! His memorial stone in St. Charles cemetery that sits among his beloved deceased parishioners reads, "The Good Shepherd of St. Charles Parish, 1970-1996".
