<u>Safe Environment:</u> Thank you for returning Safe Environment forms so quickly. We are missing several and I have put copies in your family folder if yours are missing.

<u>Snacks reminder:</u> We do have a student in the 4K-1st grade with an allergy to nuts. The nut allergy is not severe but, to be safe, <u>any treats should be free from nuts or nut products</u>. Please remember that any snacks brought to school should be on the more nutritious side, rather than more to the just-sweet side. If you are planning treats for the whole school, especially birthday treats, please check to see if the treats are made without nuts and nut products.




