#### 9 St. Juan Diego



In December of 1531, on Mount Tepeyac, Juan saw a beautiful woman surrounded by light. She spoke to him in his native language, revealing herself as the Virgin Mary and calling him her "dear little son." She asked him to go to the bishop, and request that a church be built on the hill in her honor. Despite his efforts to deliver the message, the bishop doubted his story. Mary appeared again and instructed him to gather Castilian roses from the hillside—out of season in December—and take them to the bishop as proof. When he opened his tilma before the bishop, the roses fell to the ground, revealing a miraculous image of what we now know as Our Lady of Guadalupe imprinted on the fabric. This event led to the construction of the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the mass conversion of the indigenous people. If you aren't local to the Shrine in La Crosse, consider planning a pilgrimage to visit it, even if it has to happen in the New Year. To celebrate today, try the recipe on page 2.

#### 11 St. Damasus I



This lesser known pope from the 4th century, St. Damasus' pontificate was marked by challenge, heresies and even an antipope. He was ordained in Rome and followed Pope Liberius into exile. He was elected as Bishop of Rome (pope), but others elected another pope, an antipope. Trying to get the antipope removed, St. Damasus called a council and yet, supporters of the antipope fabricated lies about St. Damasus, from which he had to clear his name and then was installed as pope. Known after his death as a faithful and learned Pope, he was rarely recognized as such during his lifetime. As a lover of scripture, to honor St. Damasus, commit scripture to memory. We've given 24 scripture verses on the back. Pick a few to learn. Or memorize one each day of Advent!

# 18 Ember Days Start



As highlighted in the September issue, Ember Days are days of preparation and fasting following a feast day. December's Ember days are the 18, 20, and 21, following the feast of St. Lucy. Wednesday and Saturday are days of fasting; one meal can be with meat. Friday is a fasting day with no meat. Offer prayers of thanksgiving for the harvests. Pray for priests and more vocations to the priesthood.

# 26 St. Stephen



St. Stephen was the first Christian martyr and one of the first ordained deacons. His witness and execution is recorded in Acts Chapter 7, which describes his forgiveness of his killers and his death by stoning. St. Stephen's testimony was a major influence in the later conversion of St. Paul (Saul of Tarsus). His feast day is December 26. As he is the patron saint of deacons, you can celebrate his feast by praying for the deacons in your lives and writing them a card to express your gratitude for their service. December 26 is also known as "Boxing Day", which stems from a European tradition of the wealthy giving boxes of gifts and money to their servants and workers. St. Stephen ministered to the poor, so it would be appropriate to honor his feast with an act of charity, whether it be offering treats to your mailman, shoveling an elderly neighbor's driveway, or giving a donation to the food pantry.

Try this easy, Mexican inspired meal for the feast of St. Juan Diego. Crockpot recipes can be great for a busy weeknight but still allow us to celebrate a saint's feast day!

# Ingredients

- 1 15oz can black beans drained
- 1 package ranch dressing mix
- 1 can corn
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1 10oz can Rotel tomatoes
- 1 tbsp chili powder
- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1 8oz block cream cheese
- 2 chicken breasts

Optional: tortilla chips, shredded cheese, sour cream, and green onions

# Directions

- 1. Place chicken in the bottom of the crockpot and cover with the beans, corn, and Rotel.
- 2. Top mixture with ranch packet and other seasonings.
- 3. Place cream cheese on top, cover, and cook on low for 6-8 hours.
- 4. Once chicken is at least 165F remove chicken to shred it and place back into soup.
- 5. Serve with tortilla chips, shredded cheese, sour cream, and/or green onions!
