From the Pastor's Desk

Year of Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

Peace to you! We are just a couple days away from Christmas Day! I hope that you have been able to spiritually prepare for this celebration by prayer, sacrifice, and the sacrament of Reconciliation. Thank you to everyone who stayed after Sunday Mass to help decorate the church for Christmas and to participate in our parish Advent Mission, with the talk by Dominic Carstens.

On Christmas Eve, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica to inaugurate the Jubilee year of 2025, which will close on Jan. 6th, 2026. It is a momentous occasion, a year set aside for the forgiveness of sin, conversion, and joyful celebration. Pope Boniface VIII called the first jubilee in the year 1300 and thousands of pilgrims made their way to Rome to visit the tombs of the apostles Peter and Paul.

Years of jubilee originally come from the Old Testament and the people of Israel. The word "jubilee" comes from the Hebrew word *yobel*, which refers to the ram's horn used to announce a jubilee year. God told Moses that every fiftieth year was to be set aside for the return of absent members to their households, the restoration of land to its owners, the release of Hebrew slaves and the forgiveness of debts. "*This fiftieth year you shall make sacred by proclaiming liberty in the land for all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you, when every one of you shall return to his own property, every one to his own family estate" (Lev. 25:10). Like the sabbath, which took place on the seventh day of each week, the jubilee was a time for the Israelites to re-establish a proper relationship with God and with one another.*

Since 1300 AD, the intervals between the Christian jubilee years have shortened, from the biblical 50 years to every 25 years at present. This year's Jubilee marks the first 25 years of this millennium since Pope St. John Paul II celebrated the Great Jubilee in 2000. It is an opportunity to review the last 25 years and to pray for renewal.

Pope Francis has called this 2025 jubilee a "Year of Evangelization" with the motto "Pilgrims of Hope". In his decree for the Holy Year, Pope Francis wrote, "The coming Jubilee will thus be a Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade, our hope in God. May it help us to recover the confident trust that we require, in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation" (*Spes Non Confundit*, 25).

What are some of the hallmarks of a Jubilee year? The first would be the Jubilee Indulgence. The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence – remission of all temporal punishment (time in Purgatory) for sin– by meeting the normal conditions (confession, Holy Communion, prayer for the pope's intentions, and no attachment to sin) and by participating in one of the following activities:

- Pilgrimage: The four major basilicas in Rome are the main pilgrimage destinations, but pilgrims may also go to the Holy Land, their diocesan cathedral or other officially designated locations. Each of the four major basilicas in Rome have a "Holy Door", which is a door that is only opened during a Holy Year. The pope opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica at the beginning of each jubilee year. Passing through the holy doors symbolizes the pilgrim's journey of conversion.
- Pious visits to sacred places: At these locations, the faithful are to engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, among other spiritual practices.
- Works of mercy and penance: The faithful are to perform the spiritual or corporal works of mercy or carry out works of penance, such as abstaining from meat on Fridays.

The Year of Jubilee offers the chance of a new beginning. The faithful who are able to go on pilgrimage to Rome will experience something which Christians have done for millenia, visiting the tombs of the apostles Peter and Paul and ask for the grace of deeper conversion. Even if one cannot make the Jubilee pilgrimage to Rome, we can bring the Jubilee to our own parish through prayer and pilgrimage to another closer holy site. When Pope Francis opens the Holy Door, he invites us all to step through with renewed hope in Our Lord Jesus Christ and His promise to be with us always to help us bring His Gospel and hope to all people.
