Highlights for February:

- Skills we are working on: STUDYING! Some students haven't taken tests or quizzes seriously and the grades show this lack of effort. - LA: everyone is still finishing verbs.
- **Reading:** 4th is working their way through *Little House in the Big Woods*, 5th graders are reading *Inside Out and Back Again*, and 6th graders are reading *The Crossover*.
- **Math**: 6th graders know all they should (and probably more than they want to know!) about integers. Their next unit focuses on fractions.

- 5th graders will work on fractions and then move into carrying out the operations. 4th graders are working on division.
- **History**: 5th and 6th graders are still in Ancient Egypt but soon will be done. Their final project will be attending a feast in honor of Pharaoh Patricia II. They will have to make a gift to bring to please their pharaoh. 4th grader history is building the state of Wisconsin out of the wilderness during the 1800s.
- Science: 6th graders will finish a unit on Bacteria. 4th and 5th graders will finish their unit on habitats. Each section will have a final project.

 Later in February all students will begin a unit on geology.




