From the Pastor's Desk

A Light to the Nations

Peace to you! Today is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which marks the event when Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus into the Temple 40 days after his birth (Feb. 2 is 40 days after Dec. 25). A major theme of prayer on this day was spoken by the holy man, Simeon, when He saw the infant Jesus. He said that Jesus is "a light of revelation to the nations, and the glory of Your people, Israel." And so, the tradition came about that on this day we bless candles, those means by which physical light is sustained.

Jesus is the light of "the nations" (which means everyone). He scatters the darkness of sin, ignorance, and evil. How interesting then that Jesus said to His disciples, "You are the light of the world." He says that we should not hide our light under a bushel basket, but set it on a lampstand so that the room will be filled with light. We are meant to be like a "candle" - our lives like the fuel needed for the light of Jesus to shine. One interesting thing about candles is that in order for the fire and the light to be maintained, the candle/wax has to be consumed. So too, when we follow Jesus and "let our light" shine, this is not without "cost." But it is a cost that is worth it! It is worth giving our entire lives to be with Jesus and to allow Him to bring the light of salvation to others. Because, as Jesus said, "In the measure that you give, you will receive." When we work for Jesus, we receive much more than we give, because we receive more fully the greatest gift of all: Christ Himself.

I believe that Jesus is calling us, our parish, to be a light to "all nations," a candle or a "community of candles" that receive the light of Christ and then bring it to others. This mission requires that we make sacrifices of our time, our resources, and our very selves. And so, I ask each parishioner to being praying daily for the next few weeks with the intention, "that the Holy Spirit to help us see how Jesus wants us to respond to His invitation."
