From the Pastor's Desk

Jubilee 2025: Media Fasting

Peace to you! Ash Wednesday and Lent is upon us! Please note the special Mass times on Ash Wednesday and some of the opportunities during Lent this year at our parish, such as Confession times, Fish Fries, and Stations of the Cross, Rice Bowls for Catholic Relief Services. Please pick up a Rice Bowl after Mass today and bring it back with alms before or at Easter.

I really was intrigued at Bishop Battersby's unique request of us in his decree on the Jubilee Year: "I ask all the men and women of this Diocese to rediscover the penitential nature of <u>Friday by abstaining from futile</u> <u>distractions</u> (e.g. media and/or social media), from superfluous consumption, as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor, by supporting works of a religious or social nature."

Why do we fast? Why would it be good to deliberately deny ourselves something good that we want? It is good for us to fast because by it we remember that "man does not live by bread alone, but by every word from the mouth of God." We remember our dependency on God and our desire to be more attached to Him than to the things of this world. By fasting from media, we are reminding ourselves that the most important connection, information, and communication possible is that to God. How much more time we would have for prayer and works of mercy if we unplugged more from TV and our screens?

Bishop cites the penitential nature of Friday. Every Friday, we remember what Jesus did for us on Good Friday, and in love we unite our penances and sacrifices to His suffering and death. This is spiritually powerful, and prepares us for the ultimate union of hearts in suffering at the hour of our death. As we are united to Jesus in His suffering, so we hope to be united in His resurrection and victory over death. I hope that you will be able to come up with a plan for spiritual growth and put them into practice on Wednesday.

Church Discipline for Ash Wednesday and Fridays of Lent

Ash Wednesday (March 5, 2025) and Good Friday (April 18, 2025) are days of **fasting** for us as Catholics (Ages 18-59, except for medical exemption). "Fasting" = Eating only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary and if together do not amount to a full 2nd meal. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent are days of **abstinence** from eating meat for all Catholics ages 14 and older. Meat includes all beast and fowl flesh (beef, pork, chicken, duck, etc...), but not fish or seafood.

These are days of solidarity for us as Catholics, who are walking together through this Lent. And so, as a worldwide Catholic family, we have common Lenten practices of fasting by which we lift our hearts up to God in prayer and love.

Bishop Battersby invites all our clergy and the lay faithful to attend the **Mass of Reparation** at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in La Crosse on Thursday, March 27 at 10:00 AM. What is this Mass about? Bishop plans to precede the Mass with prayers seeking reparation for any and all grave harm perpetrated in our diocese during our 157 year history, including harm caused by our priests and bishops. None of us can undo that harm, but we can call on Jesus to remove the barriers to his love that we have imposed, with confidence that He is eager to unleash the fire of his love throughout our diocese. With humility and repentance, we give Him full permission to do what only He can do.

Remembering our Children

St. Charles installed the Frances Garden section for babies and children in our cemetery six years ago. There are spaces for burial for babies and infants (stillborn and miscarried) and a memorial stone for all our parish children who were called home at such a young age.
