## From the Pastor's Desk March 25<sup>th</sup> - The Annunciation

A blessed Third Sunday of Lent to you! I am looking forward to the Mass of Reparation at the Cathedral on Thursday this coming week at 10 am. If you can attend, I encourage you to do so. We desire to ask forgiveness for our sins and those of all our fellow Catholics throughout our diocese's history. We trust that Jesus will forgive us and help us to repair the damage done. We look forward in hope and trust to the future.

This Tuesday, March 25th is the Solemnity of the Annunciation. A "solemnity" is the highest level of feast day in the Church's calendar, and so this day is like a Sunday in the celebration of Mass. This feast celebrates the event when the Archangel Gabriel announced to Mary that she was to be the Mother of God. She said, "yes" and God the Son, who was to be named "Jesus", was conceived in her by the power of the Holy Spirit and became man. Note that this date is nine months before Christmas day, the celebration of the birth of Jesus.
