Highlights for April:

- · I am not ready for April!
- 6th grade parents: how are the graduation videos coming? Invitations for Graduation Lunch will be sent out closer to May.
- * All Science students are becoming geologists. We've studied the interior of the Earth and how the layers work to bring us earthquakes and volcanoes. Classes are filled with demonstrations, labs, and videos. Before Easter break I'd like the students to build a spaghetti tower to test on my Jello Earthquake Machine to see how buildings in earthquake zones need to be reinforced. Hopefully there will be a volcano demonstration in there, too. After Easter we'll move on to rocks and other natural features of the crust.
- Math: 4th grade students are working on fractions followed by a short unit on understanding graphs. 5th grade students are multiplying and dividing fractions, then a short unit on probability and graphing. 6th graders are finishing their fraction unit to be followed by per cents and proportions.
- Language Arts: 4th graders are finishing a chapter on punctuation. This is their last section about grammar so now comes the time to use their skills with writing pieces—starting with a letter to a Wisconsin political figure. 6th and 5th graders are finishing a unit on prepositions so will work on their punctuation skills

next.

- History: 5th and 6th graders are finishing Ancient China. After that we'll read *I Am Gandhi*, a graphic novel about Mahatma Gandhi and his use of peaceful resistance to counter the harsh British rule in India. They'll finish the year studying Ancient Rome.
- Wisconsin History: 4th graders are finding out more about the political structure in Wisconsin. We'll write some letters to political figures prior to our visit to the state capitol in May.
- Reading: 6th graders are reading The Giver while the 4th/5th graders are just getting into The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe.
- · Skills we're working on:

- Studying for tests—creating those all-important study skills for future success. This doesn't happen only at school.

- · Penmanship.....Erase instead of writing over!
