# From the Pastor's Desk

Mary's Month

Peace to you! Happy May! Spring is in full bloom and summer is right around the corner. Many blessings to all of our teachers and students as they finish up the school year in the next week or two. And many blessings to our high school, college, and St. Charles School 6<sup>th</sup> grade graduates!

As I wrote about last week, Pope Leo's first words to the Church were the words of our Risen Lord to the apostles, "Peace be with you!" He then so beautifully concluded his initial address with these beautiful words that invited us to ask for Mary's intercession and then led us in praying the Hail Mary: "Our blessed mother Mary always wants to walk with us, be close to us, she always wants to help us with her intercession and her love. So let us pray together for the mission, and for all the Church and for peace in the world. We ask for this special grace from Mary, our Mother. Hail Mary, full of grace..."

May is the month that we Catholics dedicate to the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Mother. I have very recently, during my annual retreat a couple of weeks ago, grown just a little closer to Mary. I made the Consecration to Jesus through Mary, as explained by St. Louis de Montfort, on April 28, 2008. This was right at the time I was graduating from High School and making the decision to enter seminary to begin formation for the priesthood. The first day of the retreat this year was April 28<sup>th</sup>, the 17<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my first consecration. That morning, I received the call from the Bishop, and that evening I renewed my consecration to Mary.

The theme of the priest retreat was "Behold, Your Mother," which are one of the final words that Jesus spoke to St. John the Apostle as He hung on the cross. He gave His own mother, Mary, to be not only the mother of John the Apostle, but also, through him, to be the mother of the whole Church (all of us!). There were many times during my 5 days of retreat that I asked Mary to help me open my heart more to Jesus and His love for me. And she delivered on those prayers! There were a couple moments during the retreat when I sensed Mary draw close to me and showed her love and compassion for me.

I have discovered that many people, including Catholics, have difficulties with Mary. They have difficulties with trusting her, loving her, or talking to her. These difficulties have many sources, including wounds that we receive from our earthly mothers, not understanding well Mary's role in God's plan of salvation, not recognizing our need for a mother like her, and not believing that she can love us in those ways that we need.

Everyone needs a mother's love, but not all of us receive it. And no one receives the fullest extent of a mother's love from their earthly mothers. No matter how good or holy our earthly mothers are, they are also fellow sinners with their own wounds and "baggage". Thank God that He does not expect mothers to be perfect! And so Jesus gives us His own mother to each of us. Through her deep and unique union with God, she is able to give each of us the mother's love that we all need and desire.
