The goal of any Catholic School is that students will be strengthened in their Faith in Jesus Christ. A common question I get asked by parents (and Grandparents) is how can I keep my kids practicing the Faith after they leave home. Sometimes I hear the lament of parents: "I did all the right things, I sent my kids to Catholic School, CCD, got them Confirmed and now they never pray or go to Church. What could I have done differently?" While there is no one size fits all answer to this complex question nor is it appropriate to blame parents for everything, studies have been done to see what has worked for families that have passed on the Faith. The first of these is having what is called spiritual conversations in the home. Topics of the faith (prayer, saints, morality) should be just as valid/common as any other topic of conversation (job, sports, hobbies etc.). These spiritual conversations help children to see that the Faith isn't just a box we check on Sundays or something that is only used in School, but has a real-life application.

Thanks again parents for all that you do in bringing your children up in the Faith and know of my prayers for you. The Church is also in celebration as two new witnesses of keeping the Faith in modern times were formally canonized as saints in the past couple of weeks: St. Pier Giorgio Frassati & St. Carlo Acutis. Both of these saints proclaimed Christ in the modern world and had a deep devotion to the Eucharist. May their example and intercession continue to inspire the youth in our own times!

Dear Parents,

Vernon County Health Department, along with the local Lions Club, will be offering Free vision and hearing screenings for your children attending St. Charles School on **Thursday October 25th.** These screenings can identify children who have vision and hearing issues that may interfere with their ability to learn.

This screening is optional. Children in 4K to grade 5 will screened each year, plus any other children referred by school staff. Any child who has a parental request **not** to be screened, will **not** be screened.

Children that do not pass the vision or hearing screen will have a letter with findings sent to parents/guardians.

Thank you for helping your child receive appropriate education opportunities by ensuring their vision and hearing is not impaired.

Dear Parent / Guardian

Every child need regular vision screening and the American Academy of Ophthalmology suggests "that during childhood, babies up to age 2 should have vision screening during regular pediatric visits, and screening every one to two years ages 3 to 9."

Automated screening does not replace a complete and comprehensive eye examination by an optometrist or ophthalmologist, nor can it detect all eye diseases or conditions. Screening determines if your child requires the attention of a vision care specialist.
