What is OCIA and why should I go?

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) formerly known as RCIA is the process of formation someone undergoes to become a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church as an adult.

Typically, this would include someone not yet baptized, someone who was baptized in a different church, but who would like to enter the Catholic Church, and someone who has perhaps been baptized, but for whatever reason had fallen away from the Church and now would like to get back in the practice of the Faith and receive confirmation.

This time of formation and sacramental preparation usually culminates at the Easter Vigil Mass where the candidates and catechumens are formally received into the Church. After receiving the sacraments, the newly made Christians (neophytes) would continue a process of post baptismal formation so that the roots of their new faith may continue to grow down deep.

"Good stuff Father, but why should I attend OCIA? I've been a Catholic my whole life." Excellent question. This year, I am opening up the OCIA sessions to anyone who would like to grow deeper in the Faith. Even if someone has been Catholic their whole life, there is always more we can learn about God, Jesus, and the Church he founded. The more we love someone, the more we want to know about them, and the more we know about them the more we can then truly love them.

Over the course of the year, we will be examining the topics of God, Jesus, the Church, Prayer, the Moral Life, Social Justice, and the witness of the saints among other topics. Questions and other ideas for discussion can be presented too.

Any of our parishioners are welcome to come to any or all of the sessions as they desire. I would also encourage you to invite anyone you know who may be thinking about joining the Catholic Church or if they are just curious and would like to know more. Again, there is no full commitment needed and no signing on the dotted line, but just an invitation to learn more about our Faith.

OCIA sessions will typically be scheduled twice a month after Sunday Mass from 10:45-Noon. Light refreshments will be provided. Sessions will begin with a large group presentation before breaking off into small group formation.

Our First Session will begin Oct 12th at 10:45 AM in the school gym. Please reach out to me if you have any questions or if you would like to optionally RSVP so I can just get an idea of how many might be coming.
