Parent teacher conferences are set for Thursday, October 16th.
 The schedule is enclosed. If you can't keep your scheduled time please contact me and we can set an alternative time.

- I'll give out progress reports to the students on Friday, the 3rd. This is a great time to talk about strengths, weaknesses, goals, and how to study.
- In October I will have the students write a short report on a chosen saint and then create a life-sized picture of that saint to hang in the church as All Saint's Day approaches.
- Everyone will have a Math test soon. How to study for a Math test--they all have a <u>Notes Book</u> which contains examples and explanations of the lessons in chapter 1 to study from. After any test I allow the students to make corrections using their book or notes. They can turn the corrections in with Mom or Dad's signature for 5 extra points since not everyone is a great test-taker. 4th graders will then perfect their skills at adding and subtracting, 5th and 6th graders will jump into multiplication.
- Language Arts—everyone is studying nouns and learning/remembering how to diagram sentences. Pronouns are next.
- History—everyone knows where the continents and oceans are (spelling is another matter for another year:). We're following humans out of Africa and then will be making a diorama depicting the settlement of a Native American group. 4th graders will chose from a native group living in Wisconsin, 5th and 6th graders will chose from a native group living in North America.

- 6th grade Scientists continue with cellular structure and function. The next unit includes the study of DNA and passing traits on from parent to offspring.
- 4th/5th grade work is continues with chemistry. Some labs include mixing/unmixing solutions, signs of a chemical reaction, acid/base solutions, and Chemistry in a Bag exploration.
- Reading finds everyone getting into The Sign of the Beaver, finding out what happens to a boy left alone in the wilds of Maine in the early 1700s.

With so many different classes to teach, we're often behind my projected schedule. Please be assured that the concepts are being thoroughly taught. Now it is your child's turn to do their job as a student and study to learn.


