From the Desk of Father Reither

Fall colors and cold weather signal the return of many comforting traditions. Sweaters, hot apple cider, pumpkin spiced lattes (if you're in to that sort of thing) and of course my favorite fall tradition: The Diocesan Annual Appeal. Yes, this weekend begins the annual kickoff to support the mission of the Church in our diocese and our parish. This year our annual assessment (our parish share) is \$24,990.00

"Ok Father, you've convinced me, but what does the diocese do with all of that money?" Good question, here are some of the things which your gift makes possible in our diocese.

Your support really does benefit our parish and any amounts raised in excess of our goal are 100% returned back into our own parish accounts.
