From Father Reither:

On Friday this week the Church celebrates the great feast of Our Lady of Guadelupe! Mary first appeared to St. Juan Diego in December of 1531. Juan Diego was by nature a worrier, always running off late to something, always trying to take care of many things at once and feeling the crush of not having enough time to do it. Once he even tried to avoid the interruption of his heavenly visitor by making his way around the opposite side of the hill where he usually encountered her because he felt he needed to care for his uncle. But Mary reassured him with these words: "Let not your heart be disturbed... Am I not here, who is your Mother? Are you not under my protection? Am I not your health? Are you not happily within my fold? What else do you wish? Do not grieve nor be disturbed by anything." May we continue to have faith in our Lady's prayers and care for us too!


