From the Desk of Father Reither

Today, please see this Advent letter Bishop Battersby has written to his people and let us keep him in prayer as we continue to seek the Lord and His will in our lives and in the life of the Church. – Fr.

The One thing necessary...

My dear people,

In the Office of Readings, part of the Liturgy of the Hours in the Breviary of the Church, in the readings assigned for the day, I came across a line from St. Anselm that has captured my heart. St. Anselm writes: *I seek your face; your face, Lord, I desire*. One can hear the echo of Jesus' words to anxious Martha in St. Anselm's prayer: Mary has chosen the better part (cf. Luke 10:42); she chose to sit at the Master's feet and gaze upon his face. Truly, this is the one thing necessary, to gaze on him who lies in a manger, to behold him who is lifted up and is revealed truly the Son of God. (cf. Matthew 27:54) to gaze on him who was pierced to contemplate the one thing necessary and in this to be changed. St. Paul expresses this beautifully when he writes to the Church of Corinth: *All of us, gazing on the Lord's glory with unveiled faces, are being transformed from glory to glory into his very image by the Lord who is Spirit.* (2 Corinthians 3:18)

The one thing necessary is the Lord and we so often limit our transformation in Christ because our gaze is too often on ourselves or on the fiercesome waves which lapped St. Peter as he left the boat. (cf. Matthew 14:28). These are roiled times and the enemy of Christ would have us distrustful and suspicious of one another, of the pope, our bishops and priests, our neighbors. We fail to submit to the gaze of the Lord allowing him to make us holy, obedient and wise, because we fear losing control, fear allowing God to be Our Savior, allowing and trusting that with him all things are possible and without him we can do nothing of lasting value. (cf. John 15:5) If we truly believe that Jesus is the Christ, that he is Lord, then we will have little difficulty in trusting him and his Church, confident that his words truly are words of everlasting life. (cf. John 6:68)

The one thing necessary for this Diocese of La Crosse, for her bishop and priests, her clergy and religious, her people, is to make time on a daily basis, a weekly basis, to spend time with the Master and gaze on him, allowing him to gaze upon us that we, you and I, may become transformed in his Holy Spirit. We must cultivate in our hearts an ache for Jesus, fearing not our weaknesses or sinfulness but running to him in confidence born of intimacy knowing that we will receive timely aid. (cf. James 1:56) I hear much advice given to the pope on the blogosphere, I receive much counsel as well, the advice I treasure is the advice offered as the fruit of prayer, of the change of heart which comes from being conformed to Christ, of the humility of those who choose the better part. We are each myopic in our own way, we must imitate the humility of St. Joseph and Our Lady, who knew as St. Anselm did, that each of us knows but a part and was made in order to see him and have not yet done that for which I was made.
