From the Desk of Father Reither

I. The Beatitudes (*From the Catechism of the Catholic Church*)

1716 The Beatitudes are at the heart of Jesus' preaching. They take up the promises made to the chosen people since Abraham. The Beatitudes fulfill the promises by ordering them no longer merely to the possession of a territory, but to the Kingdom of heaven:

1. Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
2. Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.
3. Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.
4. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.
5. Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.
6. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.
7. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.
8. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when men revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven.

1717 The Beatitudes depict the countenance of Jesus Christ and portray his charity. They express the vocation of the faithful associated with the glory of his Passion and Resurrection; they shed light on the actions and attitudes characteristic of the Christian life; they are the paradoxical promises that sustain hope in the midst of tribulations; they proclaim the blessings and rewards already secured, however dimly, for Christ's disciples; they have begun in the lives of the Virgin Mary and all the saints.

Over the next few weeks, we will be given the opportunity in our weekend lectionary to hear from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. As the Catechism said, this makes up the core of Jesus' teaching. If we wish to be intentional Christians, we should be seeking to live according to these Beatitudes that Jesus has given us. A good Spiritual practice is to spend some time with these words of Jesus and see what Beatitude sticks out to you more or which one you perhaps feel weaker on. If your friends were to describe you, would they be able to use one of the Beatitudes?

“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.” Bishop Battersby has requested that every parish offer prayers for Peace and Justice in response to the rising violence in Minneapolis in recent days. St. Charles will offer a Mass on February 6th and we will offer prayers as part of our first Friday Holy Hour from 8:30-9am and again with the school kids from 2:30-3pm. All are invited to pray with us and privately for peace in our nation.
