## **From the Desk of Father Reither**

*“Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.”*

There is a tendency in our modern culture to view anything that has to do with one's faith as a personal and therefore private matter. We are often told (or subconsciously pressured) to keep our faith to ourselves and don't go forcing your views on others.

While it is true that we can never force someone to accept the truths of the Faith, the invitation needs to be given to the whole world. Jesus saw his disciples not as people who would hoard the truth for themselves, but would share and invite others to live in it as well. *“Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house.”* This is the work of evangelization.

There is a new church initiative called “invite one back”. The reality in our church today is that there are more than enough empty pews for us to fill and we all know others who used to come to church, but are no longer for any number of reasons. Sometimes the best way to bring someone back to Jesus is a personal invitation. This could be in a conversation, a letter, or phone call. There really is no need to argue and debate. Few people are argued into accepting truth and if they are, they usually feel hurt because they lost the argument! However, a joyful, free invitation can go a long way. It is also important that we witness Christ by the way that we live our lives. Being patient in times of suffering, forgiving others who have hurt us, volunteering and helping those in need etc. these are all ways in which the light of Christ can shine through our actions.

### ***The Catechism of the Catholic Church:***

905 Lay people also fulfill their prophetic mission by evangelization, "that is, the proclamation of Christ by word and the testimony of life." For lay people, "this evangelization . . . acquires a specific property and peculiar efficacy because it is accomplished in the ordinary circumstances of the world."

*This witness of life, however, is not the sole element in the apostolate; the true apostle is on the lookout for occasions of announcing Christ by word, either to unbelievers . . . or to the faithful.*<sup>441</sup>

If you feel that the Lord is calling you to invite someone back to the practice of the faith, first pray for that person. It is always God who gives to hearts the grace of conversion and we must first prep the soil so that it may be receptive. Then pray for wisdom and courage to be able to witness the faith and not be afraid of what others will think or of being rejected. In that way, may the light of Christ continue to shine in our hearts for others to see and glorify God!

## MEN'S LECTIO DIVINA

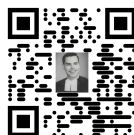

Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. ### **February 15: Preparing for Lent**
