From the Desk of Father Reither

Once again, the season of Lent is rapidly coming upon us. For me, no matter how much I try to prepare beforehand it seems like Lent always hits me off guard. But despite its penitential nature, it is one of my favorite church seasons. It is a time of going back to the basics of Spiritual Life, like boot camp for Christians. It is a time of Asceticism. In English that word has taken on the meaning of self-discipline and abstinence from worldly pleasures, but in ancient times it referred to the training done by athletes to prepare for their sporting contests. Christianity adopted the word Asceticism and applied it to the training needed for living the Christian way of life, which often goes against our fallen human tendencies. During the times of persecution, as the early Christians found themselves being fed to the lions in the sporting arenas, they found themselves quite literally competing for eternal life.

For us today, we know that there are many things that can keep us from living up to the full potential of our Faith. All of us need this time to go back to the fundamentals of the Christian way of life. In the next few days before Lent begins, take some time to pray and come up with what your Spiritual Training plan will be for this Lenten season. As a parish we will have several extra opportunities for prayer with Stations of the Cross and our Lenten Penance Service. See more on Lent below from the USCCB. -Fr. Reither

From the USCCB

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

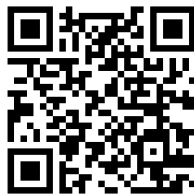
Evangelization Summit: Feb 14-15: Our first evangelization summit will be held on Tuesday, March 10, at Mary Mother of the Church Parish in

The Primary Focus of Lent - God’s Love

Our relationship with God should always begin with a realization of His deep, deep Love for us and how He continues to pour out this love upon us daily in very concrete ways. This is always the starting point in our relationship with Him! And gratitude flows naturally as we ponder this love. During the 40 days of Lent, let us start by recalling some of God’s blessings the past few days. Name five things for which you are thankful, such as taking time for a conversation with someone, reading a book with a child, a beautiful sunset, etc.

The next step is that we realize that we fail in response to this Love and that is what we examine with Jesus’ help in order to eliminate any of our personal failures that would block our ability to receive His Love. Repentance means to turn away from sin and then turn toward God. Let us seek the beauty of a deeper friendship with Jesus, which brings peace and joy, and turn our backs to the ugliness of sin, which brings turmoil, discontent and ultimate misery. A great way to start is to acknowledge the sin and then be set free from it by speaking it out in the sacrament of confession. We can’t be set free from sin unless we first acknowledge that it is there.

Kevin Matthews Broken Mary Presentation

Kevin Matthews was the top disc jockey in Chicago on The Loop. Millions of people tuned into his radio station every day. A tragic health event led

him to a broken statue of Mary, where he heard a voice say, “Will you deny me? Will you deny My mother?” Realizing this was the voice of Jesus, Kevin embraced the statue of Mary and had the two pieces glued back together, but left the remaining chips and broken pieces as they were. “She is broken, just like I am”, he realized. Venerate the “Madre Peregrina” - Pilgrim Mother Sculpture | March 13 - 15 | La Crosse

The “Madre Peregrina” - Pilgrim Mother is a life-size sculpture depicting the Virgin Mary in her apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness of the Americas. Originating from the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City, this replica is crafted to closely resemble the original miraculous image as a living apparition. The primary purpose of the Madre Peregrina sculpture is to bring the spiritual presence and intercessory power of Our Lady of Guadalupe to communities worldwide, fostering peace, love and hope among Catholic pilgrims.
